
In December, the following activities were done in classes to enhance the teaching-learning process. The efforts of teachers and the children are described through the pictures.

DIY FOR MOTHER & CHILD

Homemade Playdough

We love our handmade playdough so much (the texture, smell, quantity, and process) that we never purchase commercial versions.

This stovetop playdough has a wonderful texture that lasts for months.



Note: While little kids age 1 and up can play with the playdough, only adults should make this stovetop version.

Materials:

- $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups water
- $1\frac{1}{4}$ cups salt
- 1 tablespoon cream of tartar
- 4 tablespoons vegetable oil
- Food coloring or liquid watercolors
- $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups flour
- Glitter (optional)
- Essential oils (optional)

Instructions:



- 1. In a large heatproof pot, mix the water, salt, cream of tartar, vegetable oil, and a few drops of food coloring.
- 2. Heat the mixture on the stovetop until simmering.
- 3. Mix the flour into the hot mixture and cook for just a little longer, until the dough is no longer sticky. (You can pinch it between your fingers to test it.)
- 4. Dump the dough on the counter and let it cool until you can safely manipulate it with your hands. Knead until smooth.
- 5. Knead in glitter and/or essential oils, if desired.

Parenting Tips



As a parent, you're responsible for correcting and guiding your kids. But how you express your corrective guidance makes all the difference in how a child receives it.

When you have to confront your child, avoid blaming, criticizing, or fault-finding, which undermine self-esteem and can lead to resentment.
